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A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

The mission of New Bedford Star Kids, to provide support to children to break the cycle of addiction and incarceration, resonates more than ever given recent headlines regarding the tragic, and growing, impacts of fentanyl on the city of New Bedford. Thanks to the dedication of our staff, sponsors, donors and partner schools, we have been able to serve a record number of children and families this past year.

Our wonderful Star Kids benefit from attending small, supportive schools that serve as an oasis in the face of instability at home. Support is not limited to academics -- we have significantly expanded after-school and summer enrichment to ensure that students remain engaged and are exposed to new opportunities. This past summer 50 Star Kids attended a wide range of day camps, and six had the opportunity to attend sleep-away camp.

The Board has implemented a plan for strategic growth to meet the ever-expanding needs of families in greater New Bedford. In June, supporters of New Bedford Star Kids gathered at Kilburn Mill for our annual Starry Night Gala celebration. Once again, the Gala set new records for financial support and new sponsors, including the establishment of the Mary Jane MacLean Scholarship Fund.

This annual report highlights the achievements of the past year and underscores the need for additional support to further expand our program to serve more children. New Bedford Star Kids is on a roll thanks to the partnership of so many committed individuals and organizations. Owing to their efforts and their support of our mission and work, this program continues to have a direct and profound impact on both the local community and the children and families we serve



New Bedford Expenses 2022/23 (\$733,763)



PARTNER SCHOOLS

The New Bedford Star Kids Scholarship Program offers life-changing educational opportunities to so many students due to strong collaborative relationships built with non-public school partners. Partner schools share our mission and passion; they welcome Star Kids into their communities and understand the challenging circumstances that often accompany Star Kids. The non-public school setting offers consistency and stability, a crucial component needed by children whose family lives are often in a state of flux. The students know they can rely on their school communities for academic support and a sense of belonging.



New Bedford Star Kids staff recognizes that each child's circumstances are unique, as is each child. New Bedford Star Kids strives to match children with the school environment that best fits each individual child's needs, thereby ensuring that children receive the types of support best suited to them. During the 2022/23 school year, we partnered with 18 such schools, drawn from parochial and independent circles. In addition, some Star Kids attended public schools in 21 local communities. Star Kids understands that preferable learning opportunities or changing family circumstances might lead students to attend public schools. Those students remain Star Kids and will continue to receive all related supports and services including tutoring, mentoring and extracurricular activities.

Our partnering educators work tirelessly to fully support each child, knowing that education can transform lives. We are grateful to these administrators and teachers for their continued efforts to connect with each student, imbue in them a love of learning, and care about each child as a valued member of the school community.

One of these like-minded school partners is Our Sisters' School, which has collaborated with New Bedford Star Kids since 2015. Like Star Kids, Our Sisters' School accepts students who have demonstrated financial need. In addition to a strong curriculum, Our Sisters' School provides an array of year-round, complementary, supportive enrichment services. The five Star Kids students currently enrolled at Our Sisters' School all participate in the School's extended day program as well as its evening study hall.

We are grateful for our strong partnership with New Bedford Star Kids because our goals are aligned," explained Our Sisters' School Head of School Sarah Herman. "Working together, we can get further, faster and better, to benefit our students."

Bishop Stang High School is a longtime, committed partner of New Bedford Star Kids. Known for its academics, Stang's openhearted ethos and dedication to its students is demonstrated by the numerous Star Kids students it has welcomed since 2001.

Bishop Stang has committed to providing whatever supports have been necessary for Star Kids to thrive. And thrive they do! The 11 New Bedford Star Kids currently enrolled there take full advantage of the School's scholastic opportunities, extracurricular activities, "Faith in Action" programs, and vital college-bound guidance.

STUDENT PROGRAMS:

WHAT NEW BEDFORD STAR KIDS **PROVIDES STUDENTS**

In addition to tuition scholarships that enable students to attend the non-public school of their choice, New Bedford Star Kids provides multiple supports designed to strengthen each child's educational experience. This often comes in the form of providing funding for technology, books, supplies, uniforms and tutoring. Whenever possible, we try to anticipate any scholastic needs not provided by the child's school. Our goal is to help Star Kids succeed in the classroom and beyond, by making it possible for them to learn, grow and realize the full measure of their potential.

New Bedford Star Kids are also offered funds to participate in a wide range of after-school and summer enrichment activities. The goal of these extra-curricular programs is to continue to build a sense of community with Star Kids and their families. Through support, connections and encouragement, these activities promote selfesteem, teamwork, self-discovery and well-being among students while simultaneously developing valuable physical and socioemotional skills.



After-School and Summer Camp Programming

More than 75 of Star Kids participated in a variety of extracurricular programs this past year. Sports, gymnastics, arts, music, martial arts, robotics, overnight camp and horseback riding are only a few of the activities Star Kids experienced thanks to generous supporters and vendor partners. We provide up to \$900 for after-school activities and summer programs to each Star Kid. Families are grateful for the funds; children always have enriching and wonderful experiences.

One Star Kid who has not missed an opportunity to try new activities and develop new pursuits through New Bedford Star Kids' funding is Ari'Ella, an outgoing nine-year-old with boundless energy! Since becoming a Star Kid, this 4th grade student has participated in numerous extracurricular activities, from ballet lessons with the New Bedford Ballet and swimming at a YMCA camp, to ukulele, violin and piano lessons. To her family's surprise, her favorite activity thus far has been sailing. Ari'Ella took part in a summer sailing program through the Community Boating Center in New Bedford and was captivated.



It helped build my confidence, and I made lots of new friends," she explained. "I also got over my fear of being in deep water and learned it was actually fun to capsize!

I like that Star Kids helps people in need and gives us opportunities we otherwise wouldn't have for the activities."

SCHOLARSHIP SPONSORS

Understanding that someone thinks they are capable of academic success and a bright, fulfilling future is a powerful message to send to a child. MEASURING SUCCESS

Success for Star Kids is defined in many ways and it varies from child to child. For one Star Kid, it can mean learning to read, or earning an "A" for the first time on a paper. For another, it can mean a greatly improved school attendance record. Perhaps it's being the first in their family to graduate from high school. A child could learn a new skill in an after-school program or summer camp; another may delight at being named "Student of the Week." Our primary goal is for each Star Kid to achieve progress in school by reaching the child's educational potential. We support and celebrate every one of their accomplishments, large or small, in and out of the classroom.

We assess each Star Kid's progress through six key indicators: academic performance on report cards; school attendance; ability to read by Grade 3; high school graduation rate; post-secondary education attainment; and incarceration rates among Star Kids' alumni 10 years post-high school graduation.

Education is the best tool to set children on a path of success. Young people are more likely to complete their high school education when they receive supportive services in a nurturing community that enables them to reach their full potential. Earning a high school diploma can fill a student with pride and create the momentum they need to continue on to post-secondary education or meaningful, long-term employment. That sense of accomplishment, and focusing on education and varied enrichments, reduces the likelihood of at-risk behaviors that often lead to substance abuse and incarceration.



Outcomes demonstrate that New Bedford Star Kids is, indeed, helping set students on the path to a bright future:

Over 90% of New Bedford Star Kids have gone on to post-secondary education, trade school, serve in the U.S. military or have found gainful employment

Only 1 out of 84 New Bedford Star Kids alumni has been incarcerated, below the percentage of local youth with similar demographics and family histories

New Bedford Star Kids is proud to be making a measurable difference.

We are helping break the cycle of poverty, substance abuse and incarceration that grips so many families. These facts also reflect what is possible when we empower young people through education, raise their expectations for their future and help them succeed and thrive in life.

OH WHAT A NIGHT!

Starry Night 2023 was magical, filled with contagious enthusiasm and passion that spread throughout the night. Our panel of student guest speakers filled the air with stories of triumph over adversity, the power of family and community, and boundless positivity and gratitude. Three of our public speakers-in-the-making, Arabella, Mason and Nelson, moved us to both tears of joy and stitches of laughter.

These Star Kids definitely set the tone for our most exciting auction yet! The Clam Boil Dinner Party, graciously donated by John Saunders, was the hit of the night and raised \$7300. It was so popular that Mr. Saunders surprised the audience by generously donating a second dinner party...and the crowd went wild! Patrons continued bidding, resulting in \$94,000 raised directly for student scholarships. An additional \$52,000 was raised for the newly established Mary Jane MacLean Scholarship Fund, as well as, \$59,000 pledged over the next few years.

Perhaps it was the stirring speech given by Mark Godding, M.D., (the first New Bedford Star Kid!), in honor of Mary Jane MacLean; perhaps it was the view of the ocean from the observation deck of the Kilburn Mill Event Hall; or perhaps it was the delicious appetizers and dinner served by On-The-Go Catering. More likely, it was the promise of a better future, a future built by children who have been empowered by love and opportunities that they otherwise would not have had. Meeting and listening to the actual children whose lives are transformed through education and community, made possible by open-hearted individuals, inspired everyone in attendance. It was all of these extraordinary delights, and so much more, that raised a staggering \$240,000; the highest Starry Night revenue since the inception of New Bedford Star Kids!

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: SAYDEE '23

Saydee, a resident of New Bedford, joined New Bedford Star Kids Scholarship Program in 6th Grade and attended middle school at Our Sisters' School. A 2023 graduate of the Greater New Bedford Vocational-Technical School (Voc), she is grateful for the education she received and the opportunities she was provided as a Star Kid.

Saydee's mother, Melissa, a single mom, first heard about New Bedford Star Kids from Our Sisters' School's Head of School but was initially reluctant to apply. "I felt vulnerable, having to share our story with strangers," she said. "I was worried about the stigma and was embarrassed." However, from the outset, she found the New Bedford Star Kids' staff welcoming and understanding: "They were so compassionate; they made me feel comfortable."

Melissa and Saydee grew to understand that New Bedford Star Kids was there to fully support them. "I don't like to ask for help, so I had to remind myself that New Bedford Star Kids was there for us," said Melissa. "I was struggling to make ends meet and support my family. To be able to reach out and ask for assistance, for things like uniforms and books in addition to the tuition scholarship, was a huge relief to me."



Having New Bedford Star Kids by our side has made all the difference," reflected Saydee. "It reduced my mom's anxiety and lightened her load, which let me focus on doing what I needed to do instead of worrying about her. They helped me get everything I needed for my education and made me feel equipped for the future. I would tell any student in a similar situation to apply to the program."

An outgoing young woman, Saydee took full advantage of every opportunity provided to her through New Bedford Star Kids Scholarship Program, attending a YMCA after-school program and participating in a range of activities, from cheer and gymnastics to singing and community boating lessons.

School comes easily to Saydee, who is a conscientious student. "I've always liked school," she said, "especially history, English and humanities." She became interested in the medical field due to her longtime desire to help others. Her area of study at Greater New Bedford Vocational Technical High School was Medical Assisting, and she will begin her college studies in Nursing and Allied Health at Massasoit Community College this fall. Saydee plans to become a radiology technician. Outside of school, she works at a local multi-specialty medical group practice as a medical assistant, to gain valuable experience and earn funds to purchase a car for her college commute.

Melissa agreed: "Wanting a good education for your child can be paralyzing if you don't have the means or resources to provide that for them. By helping support us in so many ways, New Bedford Star Kids allowed Saydee to move in the right direction and focus on achieving her goals. They have given her the tools and resources to succeed and have been a tremendous help to both of us."

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


MARY JANE MACLEAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND FOR NEW BEDFORD STAR KIDS

OUR MISSION

The mission of New Bedford Star Kids Scholarship Program is to provide educational opportunities in the form of tuition aid to effective non-public schools, uniforms, after-school and summer programs, tutoring and mentoring for high-risk, low-income children who have a parent with a history of incarceration and/or substance abuse. Children are typically enrolled in the program between kindergarten and grade four. The goal for each New Bedford Star Kid is for that student to graduate from high school.

By completing high school and hopefully going on to higher education, these children will have a greater chance of breaking the intergenerational cycle of poverty, drug use, disease, depression and violence. The Star Kids Scholarship Program was founded in 2000 by Timothy Flanigan, M.D., Professor of Medicine and Infectious Disease at the Alpert Medical School of Brown University, and HIV and Infectious Disease Physician at the Miriam and Rhode Island Hospital. The first student enrolled in the New Bedford Chapter in 2001.
